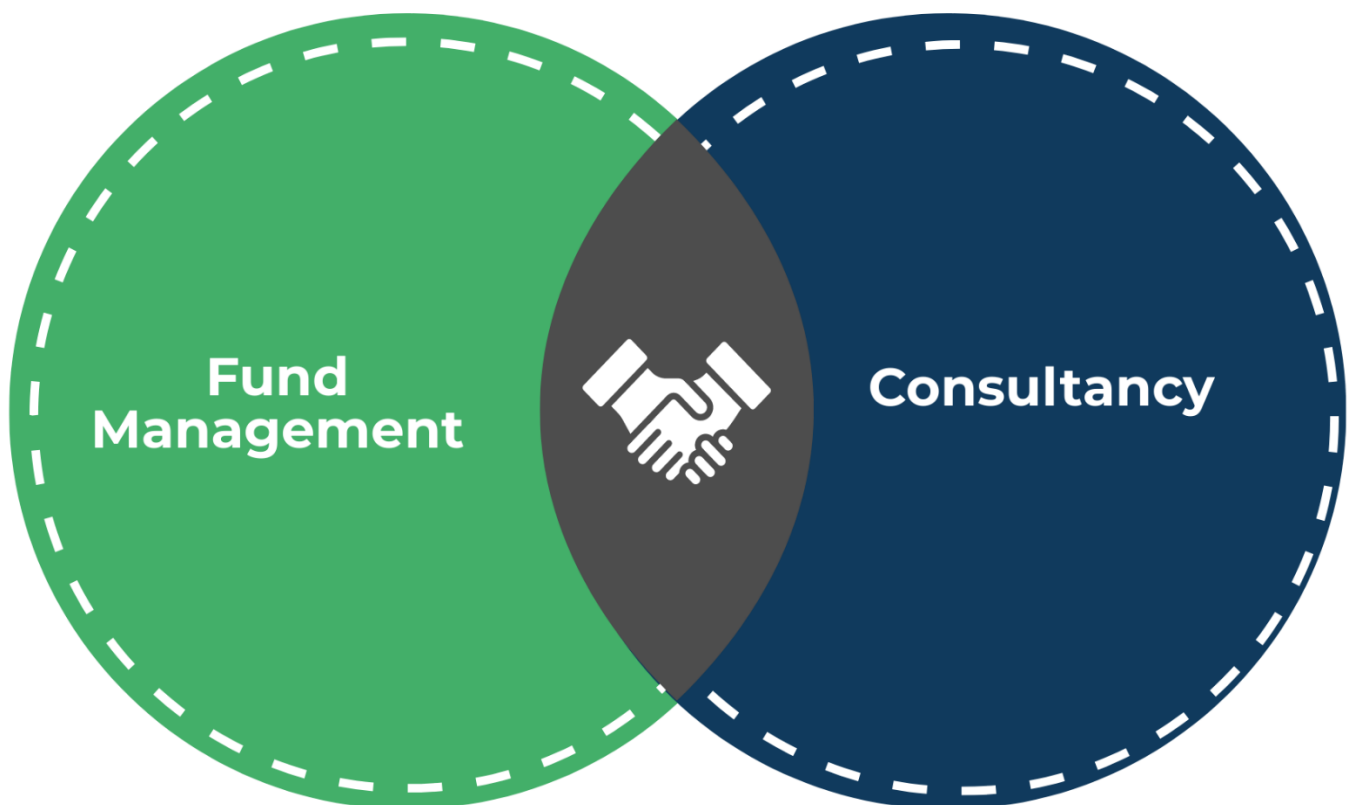

The fund will increase the diversity of Scotland's volunteer pool by addressing barriers.

Socially Connected Glasgow Strategy

Impact Funding Partners was commissioned by Glasgow Health and Social Care Partnership to lead and co-produce the delivery of the Socially Connected Glasgow Strategy. The development of the strategy considered how best to progress the Maximising Independence ambition of reducing health inequalities and improving health with a particular focus on how best to ensure local people and organisations are connected across the city to help reduce isolation and loneliness. We used human centred design to ensure the people of Glasgow are at the heart of the research and the solutions.

Impact Funding Partners was commissioned by seescape to carry out a full evaluation of their services from a range of stakeholder perspectives. We supported survey design for their key audiences: seescape staff, clients, volunteers, and carers. Impact Funding Partners carried out telephone and online surveys, undertook detailed analysis and produced a full report with clear recommendations.

Workplace Equality Fund Evaluation

Impact Funding Partners was commissioned by the Scottish Government to provide an independent evaluation of the Workplace Equality Fund as a mechanism for improving workplace equality. Impact Funding Partners developed a range of evaluation methods including surveys, interviews and focus groups to ensure a range of voices were included in the final report and recommendations. The report and recommendations were used by the Scottish Government to develop future policy on Workplace Equality.
