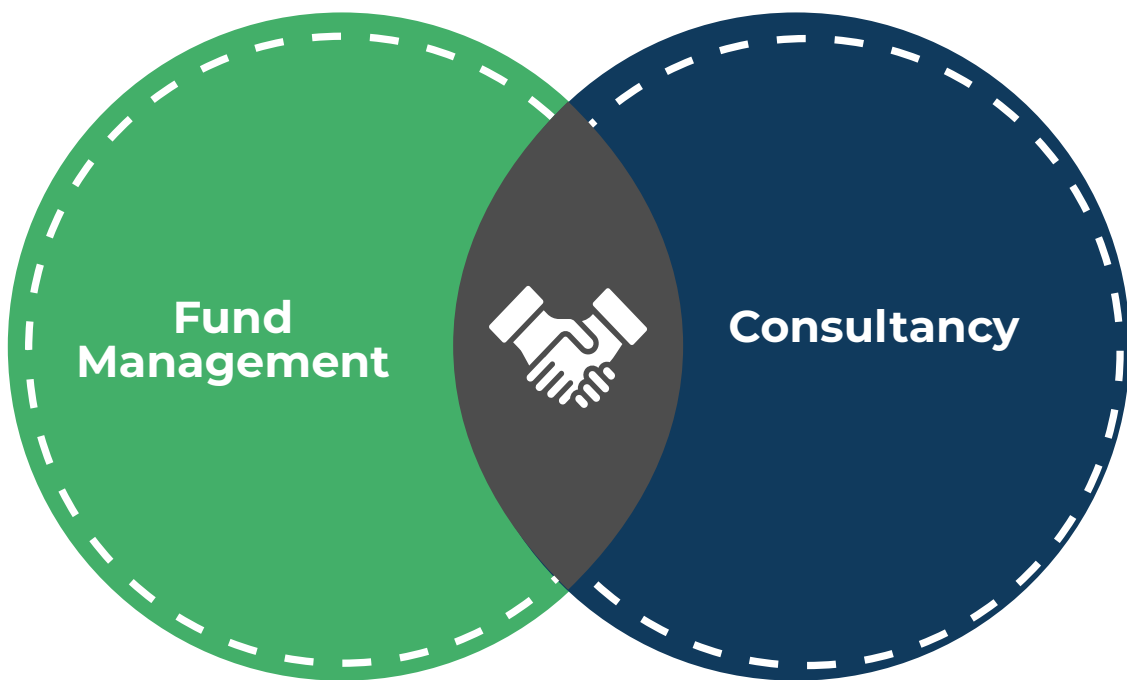

Bairns' Hoose Pathfinder Fund 2023-2024

The Bairns' Hoose Pathfinder phase was initiated by Scottish Government and is a learning phase for the creation of Bairns' Hoose in different contexts. Specifically, the purpose of this phase is to focus on learning about the systems, practices, and cultural changes required to achieve the Bairns' Hoose vision, and the methods, practices and resources required to facilitate transformational change.

Funding has been allocated to multi-agency partnerships across 2 funding streams.

Democracy Matters Community Engagement Fund 2023-2024

Following a highly inclusive process of engagement with communities in 2018, the Democracy Matters Community Engagement Fund was developed into phase two.

Democracy Matters 2023 - 2024 aimed to develop the thinking around how a vibrant, equal system of local democracy, where people understand their rights and actively participate in civic life, can be made to work in practice.

Social Isolation & Loneliness Fund 2023 - 2026

The aim of this fund is to support projects and organisations to facilitate progress towards the priorities of "A Connected Scotland" (2018) strategy, and contribute to the recovery and reduction in societal harm associated with the Covid-19 pandemic, and to mitigate the impact of the ongoing cost of living crisis.

Funding period is between the 1st August 2023 and 31st July 2026.

Volunteering Support Fund 2021 - 2024

The fund is to enable Scotland's small to medium-sized third sector organisations to recruit additional volunteers who will contribute towards delivering a new volunteering project or extending/expanding an existing one, and improve how volunteers are supported in their role. The fund will increase the diversity of Scotland's volunteer pool by addressing barriers.

Ending Conversion Practices

The Scottish Government's public consultation '**Ending conversion practices in Scotland**', launched on 9 January and ran until 2 April 2024. The work to develop legislation builds on the report of the Equalities, Human Rights and Civil Justice Committee which responded to Petition PE1817. They also set up an independent Expert Advisory Group on Ending Conversion Practices (EAG) in March 2022 whose role was to advise Scottish Government on their approach to ending conversion practices. It published a report and recommendations in October 2022.

As part of their consultation period, Scottish Government appointed Impact Funding Partners to develop, co-ordinate and facilitate a series of roundtable events with different stakeholder groups to deep dive into specific elements of their proposals. A final report will be prepared for Scottish Government in July 2024.

SPFL Trust
